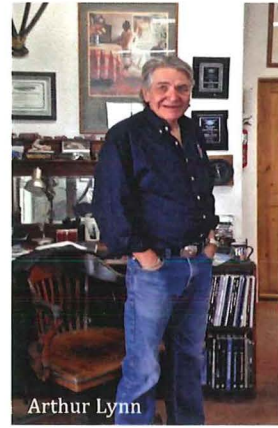
RUBY RENSHAW: I had a wonderful experience my first tour --the creative journey was amazing!

It turns out I had already met Lorraine Sandoval a couple years ago on her visit to Galisteo trying to get into the old cemetery to look up relatives. I was telling her about Stella Maestas' "truth or myth" story published in El Puente recently and Lorraine said, "Oh, I've heard that one, but it wasn't a wedding". She told me her version, and gave me the phone number for Fannie Montoya, who knew personally the people involved in the incident. Her mother, Lucia Madril (married to Thomas Montoya) had an aunt named Lola Madril (a teenager then) who refused to dance with a young man with last name of Mora. She couldn't recall his first name. The next day Lola and her sister Sillo (Rosario) were walking to school and met up with the young man. He shot Lola and then turned the gun on himself. Sillo witnessed the whole thing. This was a tragic incident, and a corrido (a ballad) was written because of it. Fanny promised to mail me a copy of it with her translation. Although usually corridos state the day and year an event happened, she didn't know who wrote it or when. More to come!
